

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$0.100000 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of **HARRIS COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT NO. 29**.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.100000 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.099451 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.112749 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29 from the same properties in both the 2025 tax year and the 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate, unless the de minimis rate for Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29 exceeds the voter-approval rate for Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29.

The de minimis rate is the rate equal to the sum of the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate for Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29, the rate that will raise \$500,000, and the current debt rate for Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29 is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2026 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON SEPTEMBER 3, 2026, AT 4:00 PM AT 12730 CHAMPION FOREST DRIVE, HOUSTON, TEXAS 77066.

HARRIS COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT NO. 29 SHALL TAKE ACTION ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE ON SEPTEMBER 3, 2026, AT 4:00 PM FOLLOWING THE HEARING TO BE HELD.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29 is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed rate by contacting the members of the Board of Commissioners of Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29 at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

Property tax amount= (tax rate) x (taxable value of your property)/100

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.
