

PUBLIC TAX HEARING AND MEETING NOTICE **HARRIS COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT NO. 29**

Notice is hereby given that **Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29** will hold a public meeting on **September 3, 2026, at 4:00 p.m.**, at **Fire Station 11** located at **12730 Champion Forest Drive, Houston, Texas 77066**.

The District will consider and act upon the following matters:

1. Call meeting to order, roll call and establish a quorum.
2. Join together in the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. To receive public comment and conduct the public hearing/open forum to allow interested parties to address the Board of Commissioners and be heard regarding the proposed property tax rate setting.
4. To review and discuss District tax rate scenarios.
5. Conclude Public Hearing on Tax Increase.
6. To consider and adopt the District's 2027 Budget.
7. To adopt the District's 2026 Ad Valorem Tax Rate for Debt Service.
8. To adopt the District's 2026 Ad Valorem Tax Rate for Maintenance and Operations.
9. To adopt the District's 2026 total Ad Valorem Tax Rate.
10. To receive public comment.
11. To review, discuss and take action regarding District construction projects.
12. To review, discuss and take action regarding any District financial institution matters, including but not limited to the execution of any necessary documents and resolutions for establishing District accounts and account signatories.
13. To receive a report from Better Bookkeepers, Inc., the District's bookkeeper, and take action on the Treasurer's Report.
14. To pay or authorize District bills and fund transfers required for operational expenses, payroll expenses and capital expenses, including any additional transactions, reversals, and/or ACH transfers.
15. To review, discuss and take action on submittals received from the District Commissioners seeking compensation as permitted by Texas Health & Safety Code §775.038 (a-1).
16. To approve the District meeting minutes of prior meeting(s).
17. To receive, discuss and take action on the Department's Fire Operations Report presented by Chief Dan Shelor.
18. To receive, discuss and take action on the Professional & Community Services report.
19. To review and take action on approval of expenses related to upcoming training classes, course materials, equipment and related expenditures to be incurred by the District.
20. To review, discuss and act on District personnel matters including compensation, benefits, scheduling, training, retention, hiring and/or termination of District employees.

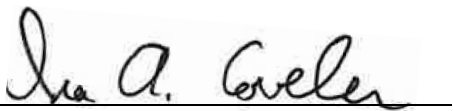
21. To review, discuss and take action regarding adoption and amendment of District policies and standard operating guidelines.
22. To review, discuss and take action on needed improvements or repairs to the District's station, related facilities, apparatus, vehicles or equipment.
23. To review, discuss and take action regarding the purchase of an IP Station Alerting System from US Digital.
24. Review, discuss and take action on submittals by the Department of thirty (30) day advance request(s) for necessary purchases related to the provision of emergency services.
25. To review, discuss and take action for the sale or disposal of surplus and/or salvage property pursuant to Texas Health and Safety Code §775.0735.
26. To discuss any new items that need to be on the agenda for the subsequent District meetings and to review the date for the next regular monthly meeting currently scheduled for October 1, 2026.
27. To meet in Closed Session pursuant to Government Code §551.071 to consult with legal counsel regarding matters which require confidentiality under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct of the State Bar of Texas.
28. To meet in Closed Session pursuant to Government Code §551.072 to deliberate regarding real estate matters.
29. To meet in Closed Session pursuant to Government Code §551.074 to discuss personnel matters.
30. To reconvene in open session to review, discuss and take action on any real estate or personnel matters.

TAXPAYER IMPACT STATEMENT

House Bill 1522, passed by the Texas Legislature in 2025, amends section 551.043 of the Texas Government Code to require that the notice of a meeting required to be posted under section 551.043(c) of the Texas Open Meetings Act, at which a governmental body will discuss or adopt a budget for the governmental body, must include a taxpayer impact statement showing, for the median-valued homestead property, a comparison of the property tax bill in dollars pertaining to the property for the current fiscal year to an estimate of the property tax bill in dollars for the same property for the upcoming fiscal year.

Harris County Emergency Services District No. 29 (“District”) has proposed a budget for the District’s 2027 fiscal year to be funded in part by the 2026 Property Tax Rate to be adopted by the District. The District intends to adopt its budget on or before September 30, 2026.

Estimated Property Tax Bill for Current Fiscal Year:

- Value of Median-Valued Homestead Property in the District for 2025: \$259,700
- Property Tax Bill for the Current Fiscal Year at the adopted 2025 rate (\$0.100000): \$259.70

Comparison of Estimated Property Tax Bill for the Upcoming Fiscal Year if the District Adopts the Proposed Budget and Tax Rate (\$0.100000) versus the No New Revenue Rate (\$0.099451):

- Value of Median-Valued Homestead Property in the District for 2026: \$238,613
- Property Tax Bill for the Current Fiscal Year at the proposed 2026 rate (\$0.100000): \$238.61
- Estimated Property Tax Bill for the Upcoming Fiscal Year if the District Adopts a Balanced Budget Funded at the No-New-Revenue Tax Rate (\$0.099451): \$237.30

The estimates in this Impact Statement are valid only for the proposed budget and proposed tax rate that the District Board of Commissioners will discuss at its meeting on September 3, 2026. This Taxpayer Impact Statement is included in the public notice posted on the District website for the District meeting to be held on September 3, 2026.
